MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT OF THE BOARD: We are celebrating 50 years of service to our community. The Team wants to express its deep appreciation for the on-going support and confidence that you have given us. We remain committed to providing excellence in pre-hospital medical care. 2011 was a busy year for the District. We expanded the Station: added a Quick Response Vehicle to the fleet (a used Jeffco Sheriff's vehicle), made the conversion to electronic patient care reports, expanded the team to almost 60 members and answered over 563 calls. HIGHLAND STATION EXPANSION

The Members of the Highland Rescue Team want to thank the residents of the District for their support of the expansion of the Station.



The expanded Station provides sleeping quarters for members on overnight shifts, bathrooms for males and females, a new bay for the Quick Response Vehicle and an expanded training/meeting room. Special thanks go to the proprietary members of Mount Vernon for providing additional space for parking at the Station and to the Board of Directors of the Highland Rescue Team Foundation for providing \$225,000 for the expansion. Team members provided over \$20,000 in sweat equity by renovating the office area, installing cabinets, and building shelving in various parts of the Station. In addition, members donated the funds for upgrading the kitchen counter tops. Contributions from District residents provided the rock for the Station exterior. Thanks to all who supported the expansion!

The Board of Directors has heard the rumors of a millage increase and wants to ensure District residents that **NO** increase is planned!





MEDICAL EMERGENCY INFORMATION:

For those of you who do not have a File of Life card currently on your refrigerator, please consider filling out the Medical Information card on the back of this newsletter. Make 3 copies: one for your wallet, one for your car glove compartment and tape one to your refrigerator. If you have a medical emergency, this information can be critical and assist us in giving you the best medical care possible. It is extremely hard for your family or yourself to gather information in the middle of a true emergency.

QRV ADDED TO THE FLEET



Highland maintains three ambulances in service.

This year we added a QRV (Quick Response Vehicle) which is designed to get a paramedic into the more remote and distant areas of the District faster than an ambulance can reach a patient. The QRV is fully equipped with the Advanced Life Support equipment found on the ambulance allowing a paramedic to begin treatment as soon as the paramedic arrives. The ambulance always accompanies the QRV on medical and fire calls. The QRV is also used for routine trips not requiring an ambulance, thus taking mileage off the much more expensive to operate ambulances. In addition to the medical equipment and supplies, the QRV has rope rescue gear and wildland fire gear on board. The vehicle is a 2007 retired Jeffco Sheriff's car and was made available to the District under the Sheriff's surplus program.

WILDLAND FIRE AND HIGHLAND RESCUE TEAM:

As you know, the recent large wildland fire just south of Highway 285 was devastating to over 4000 acres and resulted in the loss of three lives and over twenty homes.

At the same time, we had a much smaller fire on the Grapevine Road between I-70 and Idledale. Highland volunteers and staff responded to both instances. In the larger fire, Highland's Lt. Taylor Gray was Medical Unit Leader for the Incident Management Team that managed the fire, even after the Federal Type 1



Team arrived. Highland's responsibility is to support our wildland firefighters with emergency medical services on the fire line. We will respond to all incidents within the District and to other incidents in Jefferson County when requested by the Jeffco Incident Management Team. Our medical personnel assigned to a fire are all wildland fire qualified. We are proud of Lt. Taylor Gray and all our wildland firefighters.

THANK YOU TO OUR DISTRICT RESIDENTS; as always, your generosity is deeply appreciated. Economic times are still tough. The residents of the District continue to open their hearts and wallets to provide support to the Highland Rescue Team Foundation. From all of us a heart-felt **Thank You!!**
